

What is MHR Board?

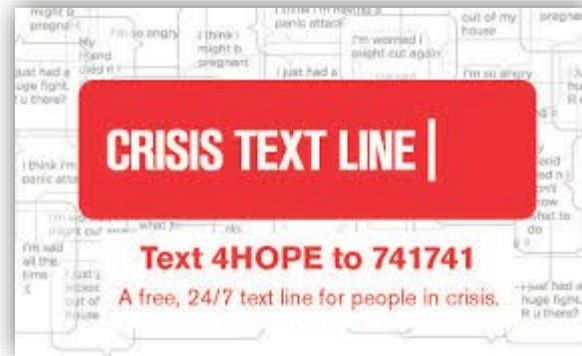
- As authorized and defined in the Ohio Revised Code, Section 340, the Mental Health and Recovery Board (MHRB) is one of 50 Boards coordinating the public behavioral health and addiction treatment and recovery system in Ohio.
- MHR Board was created to establish a unified system of mental health and addiction recovery services for citizens of Belmont, Harrison and Monroe Counties.

What Does MHR Board Do?

- County boards do not provide direct clinical services, but rather contract with local agencies to provide services.
- Engage local partners to educate, advocate, coordinate, and facilitate programs, services, and supports needed for individuals, families, and communities to ensure access to high-quality, recovery oriented system of care.
- Assure that the residents of our community live healthier lives through access to quality mental health, alcohol and drug prevention, treatment, and support services.
